CYNTHIA A. CHEN to run again for Richmond Council

Former Richmond City Councillor Cynthia Chen has announced she's running again for civic seat.

Chen was elected for her first three-year term in 2005, but failed to retain her seat in the 2008 election, when she narrowly lost by 174 votes. The next municipal election is November 19th.

Chen, a Richmond resident for 33 years, will run as an independent candidate. Chen said if elected, she'd call for an "in-depth review" of all spending at City Hall, while focusing on affordable housing and issues that are top priority for the community.

Chen, said "growth has escalated," but services haven't, adding the global economy is "still fragile"and the city must be prudent with prioritizing funds."

Homes for Seniors in Steveston

INDEPENDENT LIVING IS COMING TO STEVESTON SPRING 2012

One of the most talked about projects in Steveston right now is the buildings being erected on the corner of No. 1 Road and Chatham Street. For those that have watched the project emerge since late 2009 with the demolition of the ANAF Unit 284 Clubhouse, the changes to the site are astounding. For those who are new to the area or those that may not know the history of the site, the property located at 11900 No. 1 Road was originally the site of the Steveston Fisherman's Hospital Complex. From 1900 to 1942 the Hospital complex administered by the Fisherman's was Benevolent Society and was the site of the first hospital in Richmond which was also Canada's first hospital to offer socialized medicine. In 1947 the Steveston Unit 284 of the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans of

Canada purchased the land.

In April 2009, the Steveston Unit 284 of the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans of Canada together with Steveston (Unit 284) Holdings Ltd. formed Steveston 284 Seniors' Housing Society, a non-profit, registered charity, and they were tasked with seeing the development through to completion. So, the project located at No. 1 Road and Chatham Street in Richmond, will be a two building development connected in an 'H' pattern encompassing:

 144 seniors' housing units with integrated support services, owned and managed by Steveston 284 Seniors' Housing Society; and

 A commercial building comprised of a lounge and clubhouse for the Steveston Unit 284 of the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans Association will also be built on the site. Construction started in October 2010 and is

anticipated to be complete and ready for tenants by April 2012.

The total capital cost of this development is approximately \$46.6 million.

- The Government of Canada, through Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, will provide approximately \$2,227,500, under Canada's Economic Action Plan.
- The Province of British Columbia will provide approximately \$1,697,550 through a Provincial Infrastructure Grant.
- Steveston Unit 284 of the Army, Navy and Air Force Veterans of Canada provided land valued at approximately \$8,310,000

We have been working hard both with what you can see and what you can't. Through our website, <u>http://steveston284seniorshousing.webs.com</u> we have kept the community up to date with the development, as information became available we uploaded it to the web site and we have kept a photo book of our progress for all to see.

In late 2009 interest was expressed by individuals wanting to put their name on a wait list, so we began a wait list for the

individuals who wanted the opportunity to potentially be one of the first tenants in the new Independent Living building. We have received a deluge of requests from Richmond residents. lower mainland residents and others from around the Country and the world. Names are kept in chronological order based on the date the request was made so all qualified individuals will have an equal opportunity to become one of the first tenants. Check our website for tenancy criteria and the link to add your name to the wait list.

The most exciting progress that has happened is that we are starting to contact the people who asked to have their name placed on the wait list to see if they are still interested in becoming tenants. Small groups of people will be invited to private meetings to receive information on the development and to make their suite selections. This does not stop individuals from adding their name to the list as the wait list will be used beyond the original tenants to fill vacancies that would occur.

- 24 hour video monitoring of all entrances & the parkade;
- Meals include self-serve breakfast at your leisure, sit down, served restaurants style lunch and dinner;
- weekly light housekeeping;
- weekly linen service for towels and bedding;
- no charge access to laundry facilities for washing personal items;
- utilities (including hydro, wireless internet and basic cable TV);
- secure parking for your bicycle or scooter;
- smoke and pet-free environment (reducing allergens)

The building hosts a plethora of activity rooms for every interest including its own theatre, a fully equipped billiards room, a library, a computer room, an exercise room and even a craft room if you are so inclined. The large screen TV will ensure everyone gets a good seat whether it's for watching the news, a sporting activity or a cooking show.

You will also have onsite access to:

- a private guest suite for when out of town family wants to spend the night
- a private dining room for family events
- a beauty salon / barbershop
- spa services
- secure parking for your car

All of this without ever having to leave the building! But, should you decide you want to partake in the planned weekly outings there will be a sign-up sheets available.
